General Conditions:

- 1. This permit is valid for the dates only as specified above.
- 2. The permit is valid only for guiding or instructing in the specific areas identified on this permit.
- 3. Permits are non-transferable.
- 4. Guides and instructors must be prepared to produce a copy of the permit at the request of a Conservation Officer or Forest Officer.
- 5. The permittee will report to the District Conservation Officer or other authorized person prior to commencing the on-site activity.
- 6. Unless specifically authorized as a condition of the permit, the use of any aircraft except in emergency situations will not be permitted.
- 7. All guides and instructors under this permit shall hold a valid and recognized First Aid and CPR certificate and be certified to guide or instruct the activity being conducted.

- 8. The permittee shall be fully responsible for all actions of the people in his employ and his clients with regard to conditions specified in this permit and to the applicable Acts and Regulations.
- 9. The Department reserves the right to add any other conditions as may be required.

Special Conditions:

- 1. The permittee shall ensure that first aide certified personnel are on site at all times during field instruction.
- 2. The permittee shall provide Alberta Parks with and emergency response plan outlining process in place to deal with potential emergency situations (ie: medical emergency, first aid / evacuation plans for event). This plan shall be submitted to the Conservation Officer in Charge a minimum 1 week prior to the event and any recommended changes shall be incorporated into the plan.
- 3. The permittee hall ensure that impact on vegetation / shoreline / natural environment is minimized and all sites are cleaned to the satisfaction of the Conservation Officer.
- 4. Motorized vehicles are not permitted off of designated roadways or parking areas at all times.
- 5. All sites used by permittee will be returned to satisfactory condition as determined by the Conservation Officers by May 6, 2013.
