No Yes. Get details and limit response to safe search methods. E.g., overhead only, vehicle search, etc.

Is the subject of sound mind but being deliberately evasive? *Argument with family.*

No Yes. No response (not our mandate). Exceptions: child, mental handicap, dementia, suicidal, medical.
