





## Problem Indicators


- Prolonged coldness, numbness in exposed flesh
- Whiteness to pink flesh.
- White spots on pink flesh.
- Obvious exposure to extreme cold


### TREATMENT

- promote circulation. Drink warm liquids. Remove all constricting clothing to
- Elevate the injured area during transport. Do not allow frostbite victim to walk on, or use, injured area, unless absolutely necessary.
- Smoking and alcohol use are forbidden to patient.






Be able to identify common problem plants.

( i.e. poison ivy, sumac, poison oak etc. . )

岡 Do not damage or burn known irritating plants.

If contamination is suspected, wash the area with flowing water & soap.

Washing with a rough towel may help in certain situations.

Once irritating resin is removed from skin, the infection (pus) cannot spread the irritant.
