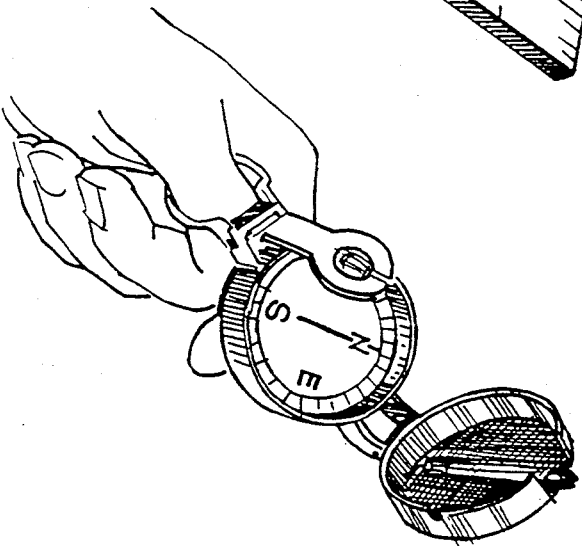

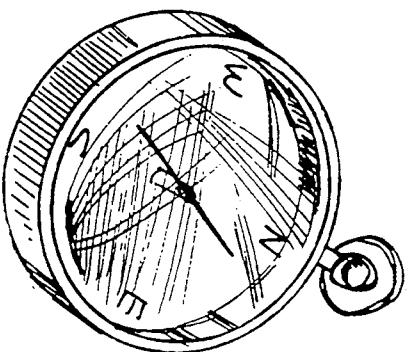


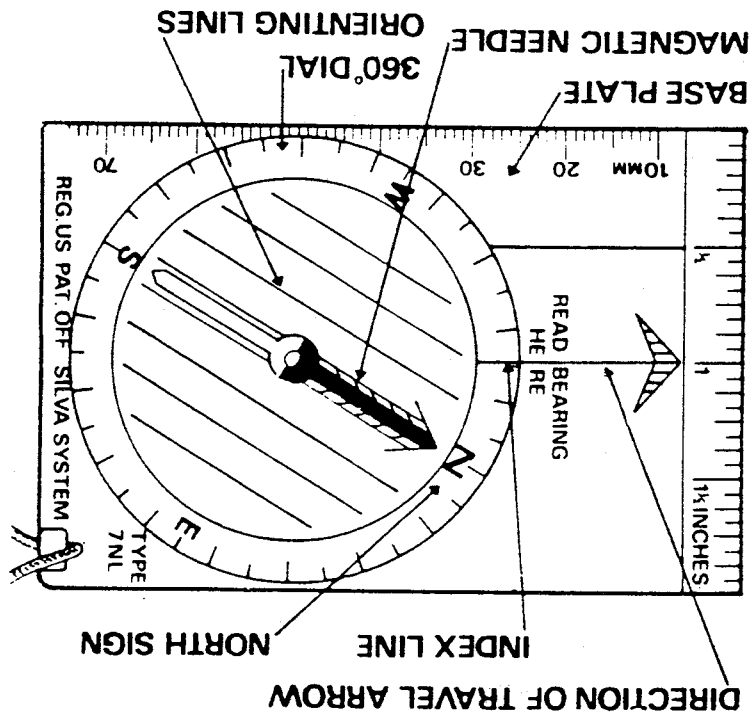

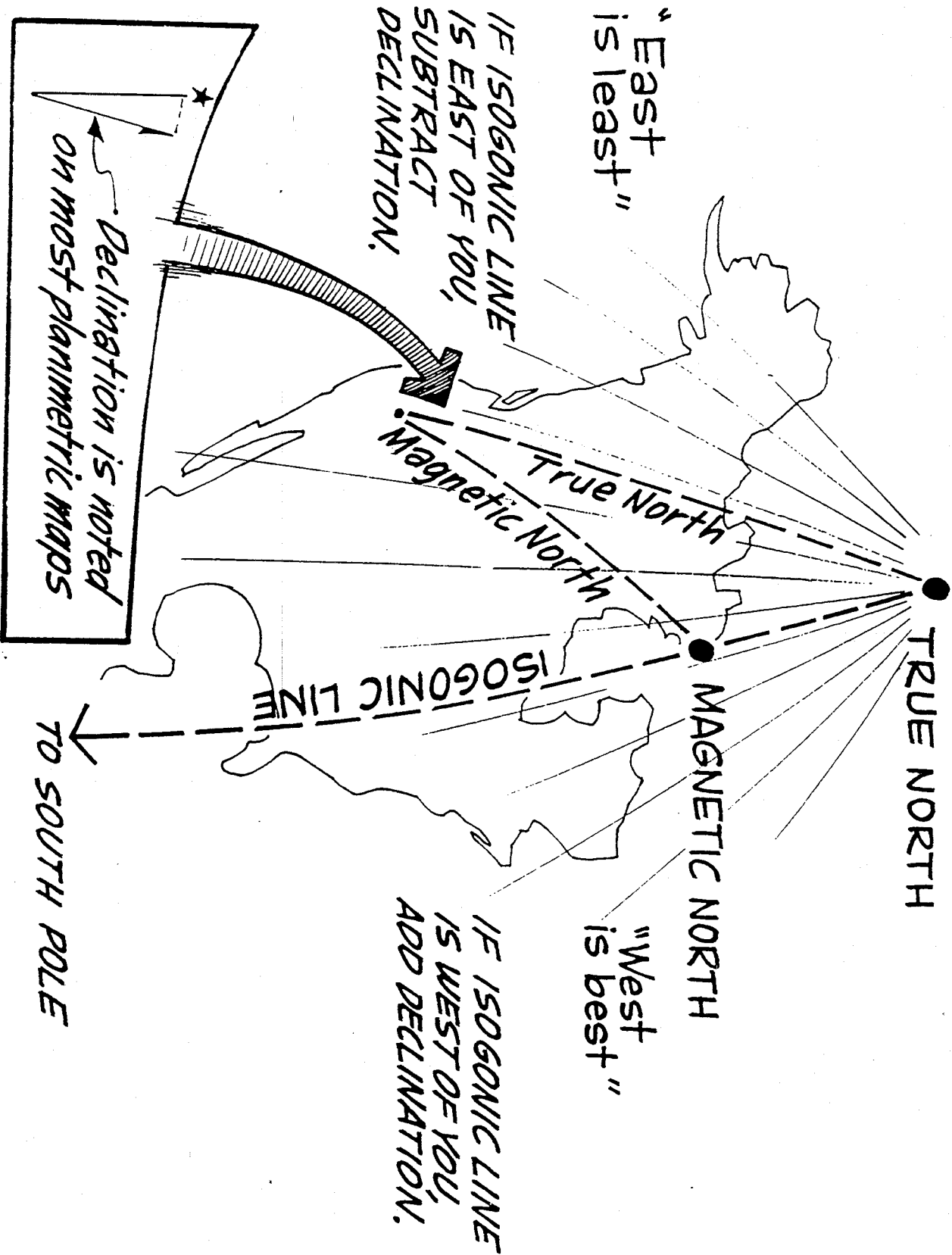
FLOATING DIAL
(Lensesatic)



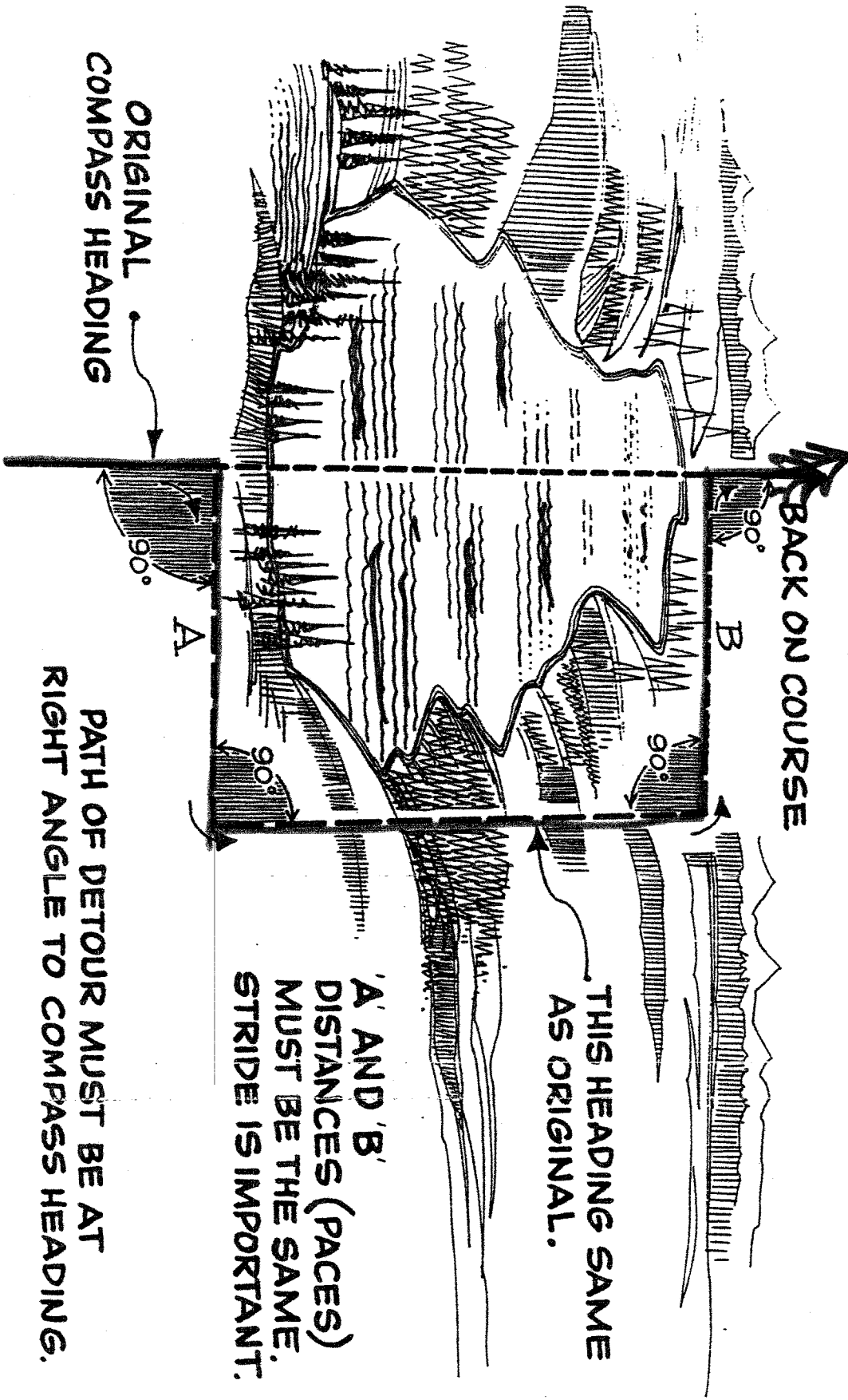
FIXED DIAL

NAVIGATING ACCURATELY AROUND OBSTACLES



THIS HEADING SAME AS ORIGINAL.

'A' AND 'B' DISTANCES (PACES) MUST BE THE SAME. STRIDE IS IMPORTANT.

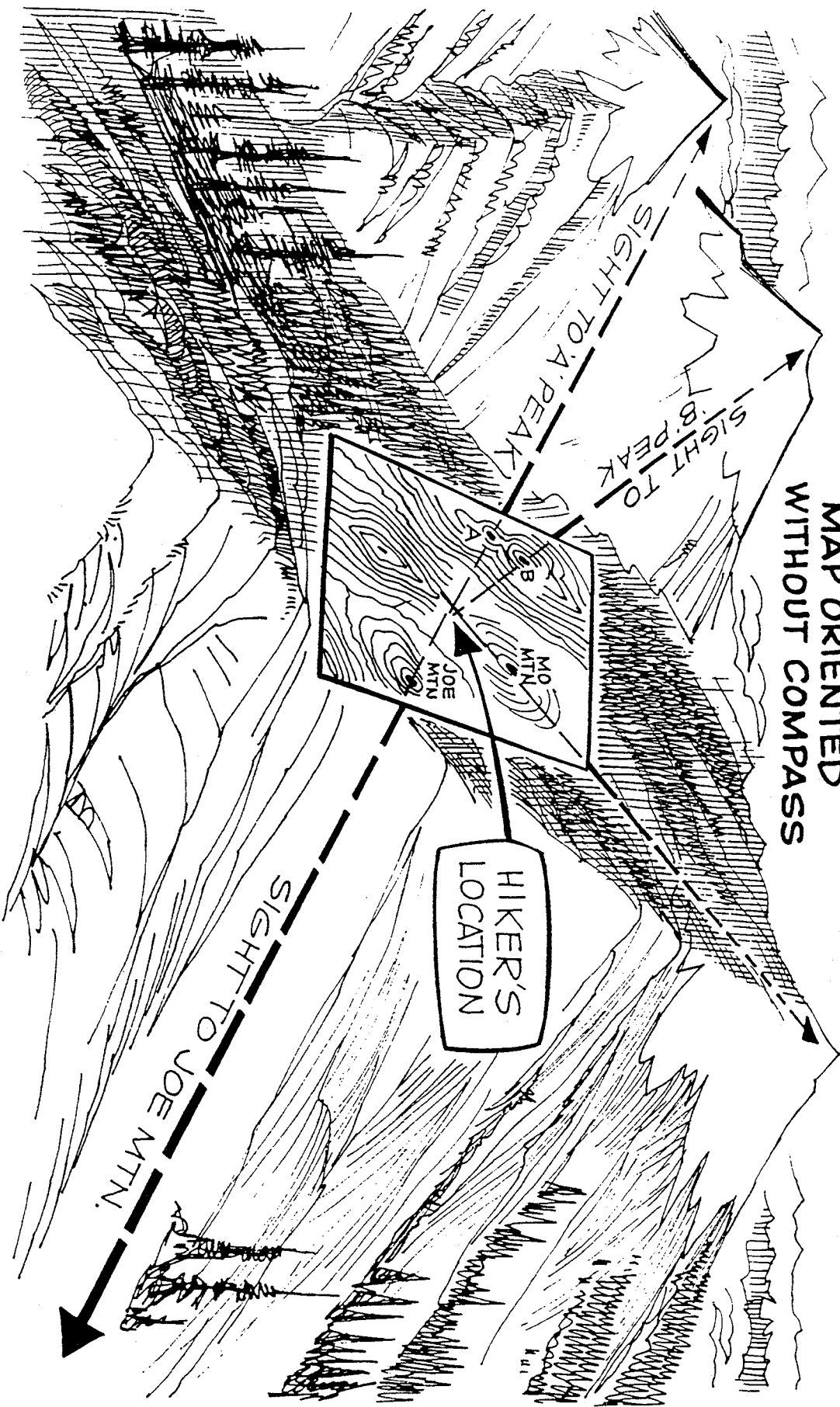
PATH OF DETOUR MUST BE AT RIGHT ANGLE TO COMPASS HEADING.

POINT POSITION FROM OBSERVATION

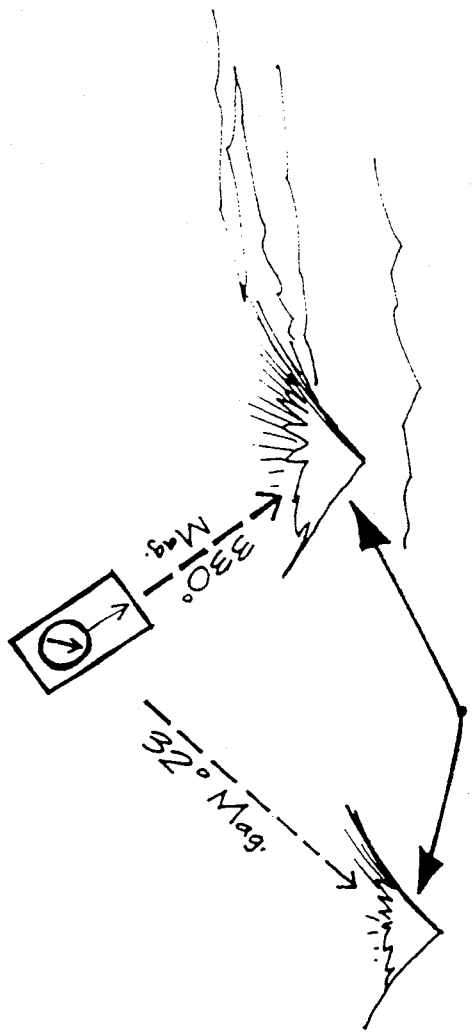
MAP ORIENTED

- FROM ORIENTED MAP AND COMPASS BEARINGS

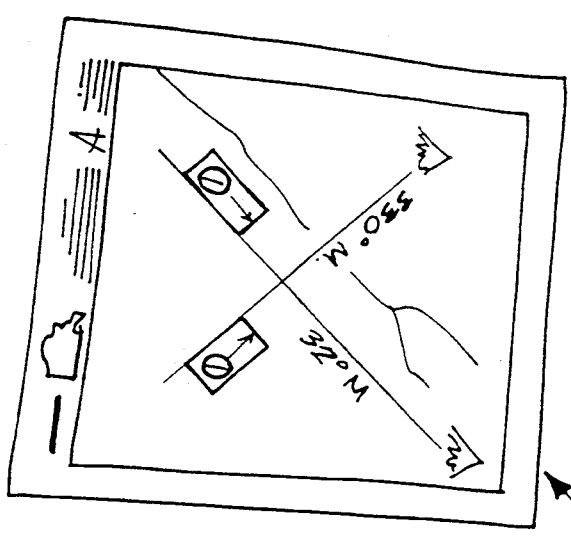
POSITIVELY IDENTIFIED PEAKS
